PREPARING FOR THE CONTEST

Review Technical Standards

This contest will follow the "Standards and Competencies" outlined within the SkillsUSA Technical Standards (virtual). Contestants should review the contest's Technical Standards prior to competing. The information provided here outlines how the contest will be facilitated at the state-level.

Note: Clothing Requirements - Clothing penalties will not be assessed during the state level contest. Contestants should attempt to wear "similar-like" clothing. Identifying items (name, school, etc.) should not be worn. All safety requirements outlined within the technical standards must be met.

	Contestant Integrity Statement Each contestant will need to complete and submit the contestant	
	integrity statement no later than February 26, 2021.	
	Proctor / Advisor Integrity Statement The Proctor and Advisor will need to complete and submit the Proctor / Advisor integrity statement at the conclusion of the contest.	
	Filming Device A device to complete a video recording. This may be a laptop, phone or other device with support devices like a tripod, microphone, etc. Preferred file format is MP4.	
	All materials and equipment needed for the demonstration to be completed	

Local Proctor Information

A local contest proctor (non-advisor/program instructor) must be present for the assessment and recording of the contest. The proctor should review the technical standard, this document and the state contest which will include an integrity statement containing additional information for the proctor and advisor.

CONTEST INFORMATION

Knowledge Performance

This contest includes a multiple choice knowledge assessment. Instructions and credentials to complete this assessment will be provided on Blackboard when the contest window opens.

State Professional Development Test – (take this assessment at your convenience February 22 - 26, 2021 / not proctored) Assesses preparedness to enter the workforce as defined by the SkillsUSA Framework, which identifies skills that are essential for success in the workplace and life.

Skill Performance

The contest will be consistent with the Collision Repair/Refinishing Technician Task List outlined in the guidelines published by the National Institute for Automotive Service Excellence (ASE) and the ASE Education Foundation, found online at: www.aseeducation.org/. Contestants will demonstrate their ability to perform jobs of skills

selected from the standards mentioned above as determined by the SkillsUSA

Knowledge Performance

The contest includes a written knowledge test given by ASE, which will consist of 50 questions covering three areas of the Refinish Technology areas. The Knowledge Test will include a 10 question SkillsUSA related tie-breaker addendum.

Skill Performance

Contestants will demonstrate their ability to perform jobs and skills based on the task list outlined by the National Institute for Automotive Service Excellence (ASE) and the National Automotive Technicians Education Foundation (NATEF). The competition includes a series of workstations to assess skills in the following areas: spot refinishing, paint identification and masking, color tinting, and feather edge/prime/block.

Color tinting

Objective: This workstation enables the contestant to demonstrate the ability to properly identify mismatch using hue, chroma and value against a vehicle standard.

Featheredge, Prime & Block

Objective: This workstation enables the contestant to demonstrate the ability to properly perform featheredge, prime and block a repaired panel to prepare it for a refinish operation.

Spot Refinish

Objective: This workstation enables the contestant to demonstrate ability to properly perform spot refinish operation. Refinish will be a base coat & clear coat operation.

Paint Identification & Masking

Objective: This workstation enables the contestant to demonstrate ability to properly perform vehicle masking and identification of paint code information for a refinish operation.

SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

The following needs to be uploaded by the deadline. No late submissions will be accepted.

- The proctor will submit the final proof of competencies. The contestant and/or the advisor can watch to ensure appropriate documentation has been submitted, but cannot participate in the manual upload.
- The proctor should not leave the contest location until all contest documentation has been submitted.
